### **Regina Red Arrowhead Vine** *Syngonium 'Regina Red'*

Height: 14 inches

Spread: 4 feet

#### **Description:**

A vine forming Syngonium producing Arrowhead shaped leaves that are blushed with red, with olive green streaks in the margins; great for dish gardens and baskets; maintain even moisture

#### **Features & Attributes**

Regina Red Arrowhead Vine's crinkled heart-shaped leaves emerge chartreuse, turning salmon in color with distinctive olive green edges and tinges of creamy white throughout the year on a plant with a spreading habit of growth.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with a spreading, ground-hugging habit of growth. This plant can be pruned at any time to keep it looking its best.

#### **Planting & Growing**

When grown indoors, Regina Red Arrowhead Vine can be expected to grow to be about 14 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It prefers to grow in average to moist soil. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
